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Premier's Reading Challenge 2014

The Premier's Reading Challenge has begun and will conclude on 22nd August. All students from Kindergarten to Year 6 are able to participate.

Students must complete a set amount of reading to meet the Challenge, see table below:

It is important to note that a child can 'experience' a book by participating in shared reading of the book or read part or the entire book independently.

There are many books in our school library which have been specifically labelled as Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) books. All have individual PRC ID codes listed on the labels to make it easier when recording books on the reading logs. PRC usernames and passwords will be distributed in Term 2, although, students who have previously participated should be able to use their passwords from last year. In the meantime, I encourage parents and caregivers to help their children to record books on the paper reading logs so that this information can be transferred to the PRC website in due course.

All students have been issued with a reading log, and if it is misplaced, one can be downloaded and printed from the PRC website; <u>https://products.schools.nsw.edu.au/prc/booklist/readingLog.html</u>

Privacy Information

Parents and caregivers need to be aware that all students who successfully complete a validated online reading record qualify for a PRC certificate and will appear on the PRC Honour Roll. The certificate shows the student's name and school. Only students' names will appear in the Honour Roll with no identifying factors.
