On September 14th Year 4 went on an excursion to visit Australiana Pioneer Village. The Pioneer Village is an old town that is styled on the early settlement of Australia in the 1800's. The village may be very old but it's very historical and the people are very welcoming. A fact about the village is that they have the oldest cottage in Australia.

Marsden Park Public School was a very interesting building and compared to our school, life at school was very different. The school was opened in the year 1889, which means it is 127 years old. It was named after Samuel Marsden who was once called the 'flogging parson'.

A favourite building of mine was 'Mitchell Cottage'. It was built in the 1800's by a famous man, Mr Ern

Mitchell. He worked on the Wilberforce and Richmond roads.

The Blacksmiths was another great place to visit, it was named after Arkins Blacksmith in 1862. A Blacksmith's shop is a place where they make tools and other metal supplies for the early settlement. During this time people used shillings to purchase supplies. 10 Shillings is worth at least one dollar.





My favourite time of the day was when everyone went to the Lolly Shop. Everyone was rushing to the store and wanted to buy lollies. At the end of the day we celebrated by running around the grass area. Everyone was happy but very tired. It was a day that I will never forget.
