Dear Parents & Students,

As we come to the end of the term, I take this opportunity to thank the staff for their dedication, the children for their hard work and the parent community for their unfailing support during the term.

SAFE

We started the term with remote learning and by the end of May it was great to see the children coming through the gate as things returned to a new normal. Thank you to everyone for following our protocols and procedures during the COVID-19 period. Our precautions will remain in place until we receive further advice from Catholic Education or NSW Health.

Afternoon dismissal will return to the usual time of 3.00pm from the start of Term 3.

Semester 1 Reports

Yesterday students received their Semester 1 Report. Due to COVID-19, changes to our normal student learning report were needed as a result of the introduction of remote learning. The report is a reflection of your child's learning, social development, work habits and engagement with remote learning.

A great deal of time and consideration is put into awarding achievement levels for each student. Achievement levels are awarded based on a number of variables such as student work samples, assessment tasks, observations and class work.

When reading your child's report, remember to pay attention to your child's effort, social development and work habits. These four tips may help:

- 1. Look for strengths first. Focus on strengths even if they are not in the traditional 3Rs or core subjects.
- 2. Take into account your child's effort and attitude to learning. If the report indicates that effort needs attention, then they have something to work on. If your child is putting in the required effort, speak to your child about how pleasing this is and how it has a positive impact on their learning.
- 3. Broaden your focus to form a picture of your child's progress as a member of a social setting. How your child gets along with his or her peers will influence their happiness and well-being, as well as give an indicator to his/her future.

4. Discuss the report with your son or daughter talking about strengths first before looking at areas that need improvement. Ask for their opinion about how they performed and discuss their concerns.

Parent/teacher conferences for Semester 1 are optional. Please contact your child's teacher through the office if you require a parent/teacher conference. Parent/teacher conferences will be conducted keeping to social distance protocols.

<u>Haircuts</u>

Please be reminded about the school's policy in regard to haircuts. Boy's haircuts must be sensible, normal cuts with short back and sides. Rat tails are not permitted. Girls must have their hair tied back if it is long, with blue or white hair ties or ribbons. No colour should be put in children's hair at any time. Children's hair is not to be shaved or have shapes or designs in it. We would appreciate your support of this policy.

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
Online Practices — Internet Safety for Kids
