PARKING & DRIVING OFFENCES AROUND SCHOOLS

Below is a copy of a flyer we have received from Blacktown City Council in regard to common driving offences committed in School Zones.

A number of parents have, unfortunately, already been fined for these offences, so it is very important to take note of what the offences are and fines applied.

As the flyer says, children are small, harder to see, behave unpredictably and are extremely vulnerable. They need you to take extra care when driving and parking around school zones.

Police and Council Rangers will be conducting checks to ensure that laws are obeyed and children are kept safe.

**SCHOOL ZONE OFFENCES
WHAT ARE YOU RISKING? ***

FACT Children are small, harder to see, behave unpredictably and are extremely vulnerable. They need **YOU** to take extra care when driving and parking around school zones.

<p>NO PARKING No waiting. You have 2 minutes to drop-off or pick-up. You must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle.</p> <p>Penalties from \$191 +2 DEMERIT POINTS</p>	<p>PEDESTRIAN CROSSING 1. In a queue of traffic, no part of your vehicle can stop on a pedestrian crossing. 2. Do not let your child in or out of a vehicle at a pedestrian crossing as this is a No Stopping zone.</p> <p>Penalties from \$457 +2 DEMERIT POINTS</p>
<p>NO STOPPING You must not stop on a length of road with a no stopping sign. The first 10 metres from an intersection is a no stopping zone. Yellow kerb lines are also a No Stopping zone.</p> <p>Penalties from \$344 +2 DEMERIT POINTS</p>	<p>DRIVEWAYS & FOOTPATHS Do not park on or across a driveway or footpath.</p> <p>Penalties from \$344 +2 DEMERIT POINTS</p>
<p>BUS ZONE Only a public bus can stop in a bus zone.</p> <p>Penalties from \$344 +2 DEMERIT POINTS</p>	<p>U TURNS U turns are illegal on or near a pedestrian crossing and across a double white line.</p> <p>Penalties from \$344 +3 DEMERIT POINTS</p>
<p>MOBILE PHONES Extra fines apply for using a mobile phone in a school zone. <i>May be subject to Double Demerits</i></p> <p>Penalties from \$457 +5 DEMERIT POINTS</p>	<p>DOUBLE PARKING Double parking is illegal and is very dangerous in a school zone.</p> <p>Penalties from \$344 +2 DEMERIT POINTS</p>
<p>SPEEDING OFFENCES 40km/h is the limit. Children are vulnerable, so slow down in school zones. <i>May be subject to Double Demerits</i></p> <p>Penalties from \$200 +2 DEMERIT POINTS</p>
