Dear Parents and Children,

Next week is Catholic Schools Week. The theme for this year is Celebrating 200 Years of Catholic Education. I know you join with me in thanking the staff for the wonderful work they do at Sacred Heart, not only during Catholic Schools Week, but every week, every day. We have a solid well deserved reputation for being a highly effective school. This reputation is built upon high expectations, focused teaching, engaged learning, a positive school environment and effective home/school links.

Our celebration for Catholic Schools Week will depend upon COVID-19 restrictions. At the moment parents are still not permitted on site for Liturgies and Assemblies. This means parents will not be able to attend the Catholic Schools Week Liturgy. Should this restriction change we will inform you.

Athletics Carnival

Our Primary Athletics Carnival will be held on Tuesday, 9th March at Blacktown Sportspark Eastern Road. Students in Years 2 - 6 will be participating in the Athletics Carnival. Our wonderful Sports Coordinator, Mrs Penton, has sent home in formation about the carnival. **Due to COVID restrictions parents are not permitted to attend the carnival.**

Cross Country

Our school Cross Country will take place on Tuesday, 16th March, around the school grounds. The 8, 9 and 10 year olds run 2km and the 11, 12 and 13 year olds run 3km. Students wear sports uniform and school hat and bring a water bottle. Asthmatics need to ensure they have medication at school.

National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN)

Early next term Year 3 and Year 5 students will be involved in this nationwide standardised assessment. The assessments will take place between 11th - 20th May. It is very important all Year 3 and Year 5 students attend school on each of these days.

Importance of Attendance

For students to succeed at school it is very important that they are at school every day unless they are sick. If a student misses one day of school a fortnight it will add up to missing 1 year of school over the course of 12 years of schooling! Every day counts!

School Commencement and Finishing Times

School commences at 8.50am and concludes at 3.00pm. Any child that arrives after this time or leaves school earlier for an appointment etc will need to do so through the office. It is very important that your child arrives at school on time. Children arriving late to school or leaving early, miss out on valuable learning time and this disrupts their fellow students. If your children are late to school, they are to be escorted to the School Office by a parent/carer.

A Good Nights Sleep

It is also very important that students have enough sleep every night to prepare them for the following day's learning. Students cannot maintain concentration if they have not had enough sleep as there is no opportunity for 'rest periods' during the day. On occasion we hear from students that they have not gone to bed until the early hours or they have been playing electronic games until late in the night. These students will not learn the next day.

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TOO SICK FOR SCHOOL?

As we head into the cooler weather, it is timely that we remind you of some guidelines about when to keep children home from school. **Generally, if your child feels unwell, keep them home, consult your doctor if necessary and send a note with your child on their return to school.** Children who are sick, will be sent home.

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Conjunctivitis	The eye feels 'scratchy', is red and may water. Lids may stick together on waking.	Keep your child home until they are feeling better. Antibiotics may be needed.
Diarrhoea	Two or more consecutive bowel motions that are looser and more frequent than normal and possibly stomach cramps.	Keep your child home for at least 24 hours after diarrhoea stops.
Gastroenteritis	A combination of frequent loose or watery stools (diarrhoea), vomiting, fever, stomach cramps, headaches.	Keep your child home for at least 24 hours after diarrhoea and/or vomiting stops.
Hayfever	Sneezing, a blocked or runny nose, itchy eyes, nose and throat, headaches	Unless they feel unwell or are taking a medication which makes them sleepy, children can still attend school.
Head lice or Nits	Itchy scalp, white specks stuck near the base of the hairs; lice may be found on the scalp.	Do not send to school until treated. Treat head lice each night and treat the rest of your family. Advise the school.
Influenza (Flu)	Sudden onset fever, runny nose, sore throat, cough, muscle aches and headaches.	Carry out a COVID test and provide results before children return to school. Keep children home until they are symptom free.
Common Cold	Runny nose and cough—no fever.	Carry out a COVID test and provide results before children return to school. Keep children home until they are symptom free.



NEW PARKING RULES

- EDITH STREET -

Parents may have noticed the new parking restrictions in **Edith Street** (just off Nelson Street). **From 8:00am until 9:30am each school day**, parents can only pull up and drop off children in the newly marked area. Parents are <u>not</u> permitted to park or leave their car.
